October 20, 2011
6:30 p.m.

Present:

Farmington Town Board: Councilmen Mickelsen, Casale, and Holtz and Supervisor Fafinski

Hopewell Town Board: Councilwoman Schadler and Supervisor Green

Canandaigua Town Board: Councilman Fennelly and Supervisor Casella

Supervisor Fafinski called the meeting of the Towns of Farmington, Hopewell and Canandaigua to order at 6:42 p.m.

Water & Sewer Superintendent Jim Crane explained the 2012 proposed budget and how the tax cap will affect the budget year. He also explained the 2012 Ratio of Apportionment and Operating Budget to determine tax rates.

There was discussion on passing extra resolution in addition to the Local Law on the Tax Cap. Each town will need to adopt a Local Law then the District Resolution then adopt the budget.

Motion moved by Supervisor Green seconded by Councilman Casale to adopt the proposed 2012 Canandaigua/Farmington Water District budget. All present voted Aye. Carried.

The Audit Committee (Supervisor Casella, Supervisor Fafinski, and Water & Sewer Superintendent) discussed the appointment of a Fiscal Officer. Motion by Supervisor Green seconded by Supervisor Casella to appoint Ted Fafinski as Fiscal Officer. All present voted Aye. Carried.

Jim Crane stated that the City of Canandaigua will be reducing their water rates by two cents for next year. Their ratio of water rates is usually on the upscale not on the down scale so with that being given that is how he projected out the budget for this year with an increase of 3-5%. He

added that the Farmington Town Board is aware that his budget reflects increasing water rates by ten cents which is a 2.8% increase over last year's rates.

Supervisor Casella asked why the average bill would go from \$77.70 to \$84.00 quarterly. Superintendent Crane replied that is due to the amount to be raised by tax increasing. He added that they will need to increase \$.10 for the next three years. Superintendent Crane will prepare and publish the notice in the local media and the respective boards will need to do resolutions.

Superintendent Crane stated that the sewer rate will increase by \$5.00 per quarter.
