The Columbarium at King of Glory provides extension of the pastoral ministry and continuing care. The Columbarium garden is most beautiful in its appropriate setting near the Font and Altar and House of the living God.

When we celebrate the Holy Eucharist on the Lord's Day, we are made aware that we live in the midst of "Angels and archangels and all the company of heaven". One can feel the presence of unseen beings. King of Glory Columbarium Garden

The King of Glory Columbarium Garden is a place of beauty and prayer. It is a visible reminder to the worshiping Body of Christ by serving to keep the sacred remains of those we have loved in this life.

There is a long history and tradition of burial in Christian Churches and many present-day churches have such a place available. King of Glory now offers such a facility for the disposition of the remains of those who have been cremated. The Columbarium Garden is adjacent to the worship sanctuary, enclosed and protected yet always available.

Cremains may be kept in wall enclosures, in individual containers or commingled with their earthly companions in the ground crypt. A memorial wall plaque shows the names engraved of all whose cremains are kept in the common ground crypt.

The Columbarium is planned for the inurnment of baptized current members of King of Glory, baptized ascendants, first generation descendants, and spouse, or unmarried partner of such person. Inurnment may be granted to previous members of King of Glory upon the recommendation of the lead Pastor. Exceptions to this policy will be decided upon by the Columbarium Trustees upon the recommendation of the lead Pastor.

Application for space can be obtained in the Church office or by completing a request for further information. Choice of location will be based upon the date of receipt of a signed agreement. The Columbarium Trustees maintain permanent records and care of the Garden as a sacred trust. Advanced planning for disposition of ashes and/or accompanying services is encouraged.

The above buyers may share the one-time cost if desired. In so doing each investor becomes a "Buyer" and will be under separate, individual contracts with King of Glory Columbarium. A designated unmarried partner of a member Buyer will have the same rights of use as other designated persons.

At the time of purchase, Buyer shall designate by name the person or persons whose remains may be interred. Niche cubicles may be used for holding up to 4 each.

Except with the written consent of King of Glory, Buyers' rights may not be assigned, transferred or inherited, and shall not be subject to claims of creditors. Buyers' rights are no longer assignable after the interment of the Buyer in a crypt or niche.

EXAMPLE: QUAD WALL NICHE USE

- One person Buyer: with/without designated person(s)
- Two person Buyers: with/without designated person(s)
- Three person Buyers: with/without designated person(s)
- Four person Buyers: may or may not be married couple

EXAMPLE: ONE-HALF WALL NICHE USE

- One person Buyer: with/without designated person
- Two person Buyers: need not be married couple

USE REQUIREMENTS

Cremains deposited directly into the common crypt will be commingled. In wall niches, remains shall be placed in a suitable container which is deposited in the niche. The name and dates of birth and death shall be marked on the outside and within the container. A religious service shall be held at each interment with a member of the King of Glory clergy supervising or coordinating the service. The names of all interred in the common crypt will be shown on the wall plaque, the names of those in the wall niches will be shown on the individual niche cover. Flowers may be placed in small containers in the garden area with discretion and good taste on Memorial Day and at Christmas for three days, after which they shall be removed by persons who placed them.

Records of interment locations will be maintained in the permanent church archives.
